**Entering Kindergarten**

Families are encouraged to share a variety of books with their children, alphabet and counting books, stories emphasizing colors and shapes, rhyming tales, poetry and especially nursery rhymes.

It is suggested that when a child is read to, the adult points out the cover, title and author's name and lines of print and talks about the illustrations. During and after reading talk about characters and events from the story, make connections to the child's own life and share the love of reading. Children will enjoy becoming familiar with the stories of some of these authors:
